### Ministers' Message

Many, many years ago, the Greek philosopher Heraclitus wrote: "No one ever steps in the same river twice, for it's not the same river and they are not the same person."

Change is a part of life. Some changes are good; some are more challenging. Most change leaves us somewhere in between. Happily, the changes that come with spring are fresh and wonderful. Spring teaches us that change can be a positive force for renewal and energy.

The story of Easter brings the same lesson. That first Holy Week, the disciples did not know what the future would hold. As the week progressed, their leader continued to upset the authorities of the day, more and more deeply. Even the crowds who were on his side at the beginning of the week, turned against him in the end. Their leader dying like a common criminal and laid in a borrowed grave, the disciples must have sat in paralyzing fear and disbelief. Despite Jesus' best efforts, this was a change they were not prepared for.

And, then, Easter happened! God brought new life to Jesus and to all who would receive it. This change was full of opportunity and new possibilities.

Knowing that change is inevitable and always preparing for the possibilities of renewal and newness of life, is the most faith-filled way to face new realities. Over time, the disciples learned

this. After Jesus' ascension into heaven, out of fear, they sat and awaited Pentecost. Despite all the change they had experienced, they learned that, when Jesus is alive and well in our hearts and in and amongst the people, the Spirit is unstoppable!

There will be many goodbyes, but also the excitement of welcoming a new minister with different strengths and ideas and new energy. Changes do come our way, and yet always preparing for the possibilities of renewal and newness of life, is the most faith-filled way to face new realities. 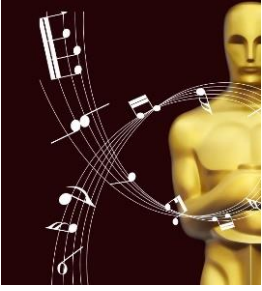

## Search Process Update

At a congregational meeting on Sunday, March 3rd, the congregation's living faith story and position description for a new minister were approved. These will serve as the main "marketing tool" to attract a new minister. A search committee was also struck, with the direction to seek for one full-time minister.

Due to the recognition that our congregation will be moving from 1½-time ministry to 1 full-time minister, at the most recent congregational annual meeting it was agreed that \$20,000 a year would be drawn from the trustees' holdings for the next five years, in order to hire staffing that would support the new minister. It is anticipated that the support required will be around Christian

education, audio technical, and pastoral care needs. At the most recent Council meeting, it was agreed that a search for a Children's Program Director would begin this spring.

Many thanks to those who worked in a timely fashion to create the living faith story and the position description. Members of the search committee are: Paul Griffen, Sandra Halls, Rusty Hick, Drew Hollett, Pamela Hollett, Carolyn MacKinnon, and Geoff Manns. It is hoped that there will be a new minister in place early this fall, but of course there are no guarantees. Please hold this entire process in your prayers, and may we all welcome our new minister with the same care and energy that we welcomed Elaine and Don.
